I understand that all dogs need monthly grooming including baths, brushing, ear cleaning and nail trimming. I understand that non-shedding dogs have hair that never stops growing so their hair will need to be trimmed more often. I am willing to take my dog to the groomer every 4-6 weeks if I can't do these things myself. I understand that all dogs need to be a healthy weight and fed a well balance diet that includes high quality ingredients (low or no corn, wheat & soy) and be provided with toys/treats to prevent dental disease. I understand that all dogs need mental as well as physical activity to be happy and avoid problem behaviors. This includes, and not limited to, daily walks, play groups, and positive reinforcement (reward-based) training. It is my responsibility to provide daily quality time/activities with my dog to promote bonding & trust and prevent problem behaviors from occurring. I understand that rescue dogs often come with an unknown history and therefore age, breed, health, and temperament are an estimate or "best guess" provided by veterinarians, foster parents, shelters or previous homes. I understand that rescue dogs often have been through a stressful situation and coming into a new home, even a good one, is another stressor. I am willing to be patient and positive with my new rescue dog.
